

2021/22 Brown Marmorated Stink Bug (BMSB) Season Sea Cargo from Italy to NZ

- BMSB Season runs from 1st September to 30th April
- All Commodities ex Italy are considered “High Risk” therefore require OFFSHORE treatment- [click here](#), unless approved prior to arrival by MPI as a Sensitive Risk Goods. See Full List- [click here](#)
- Untreated High Risk Cargo WILL NOT be allowed to come ashore in most instances
- All offshore treatment must be supported by a BMSB Treatment Certificate, carried out by an MPI approved offshore treatment provider. [click here](#)
- Fully enclosed sea container(six-sided metal sea containers) must be sealed within 24 hours of treatment and remain sealed



The list of sensitive risk goods that an MPI CTO considers to be sensitive to treatment :

- Agricultural compounds and veterinary medicines;
- Food for human consumption (including beverages);
- Fresh produce;
- Frozen food products;
- Live animals;
- Leather goods (apparel and furniture)
- Pet food;
- Pharmaceutical products;
- Polyurethane bales and foam products;
- Refrigerated goods;
- Seed for sowing;
- Tank-tainers and
- Textiles (including yarn).
